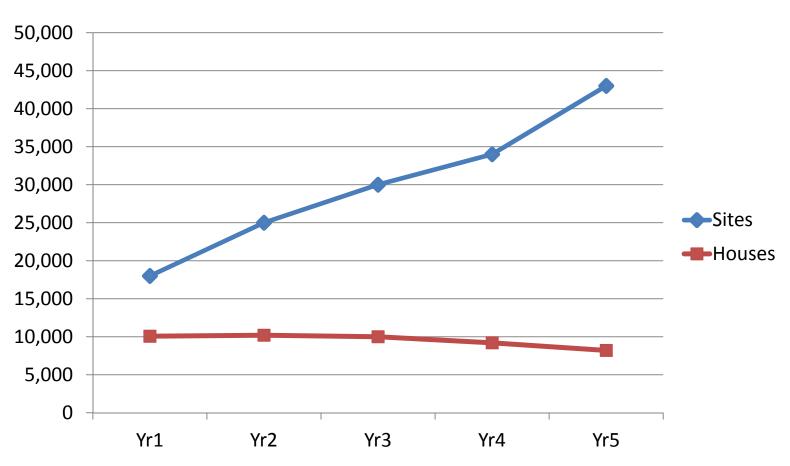

- The HOD intends to finalise and sign off these pipelines with municipalities in order to ensure projects are implemented timeously and any potential blockages detected and acted upon well in advance

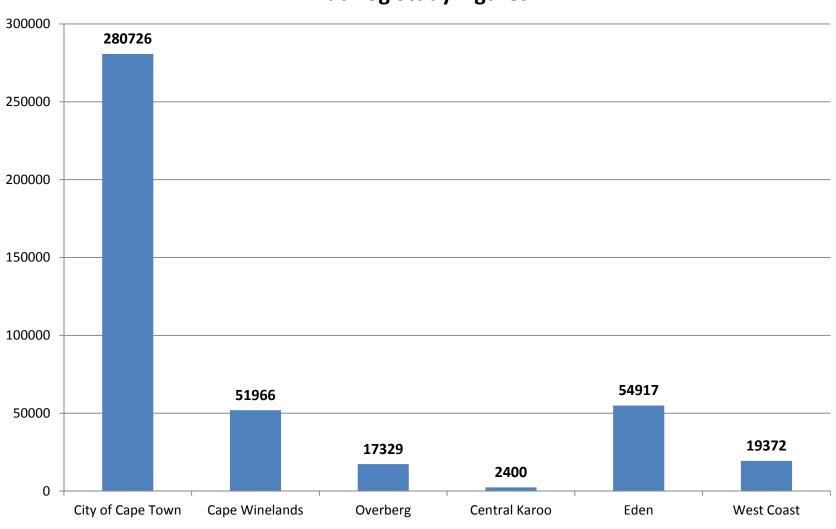

INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS

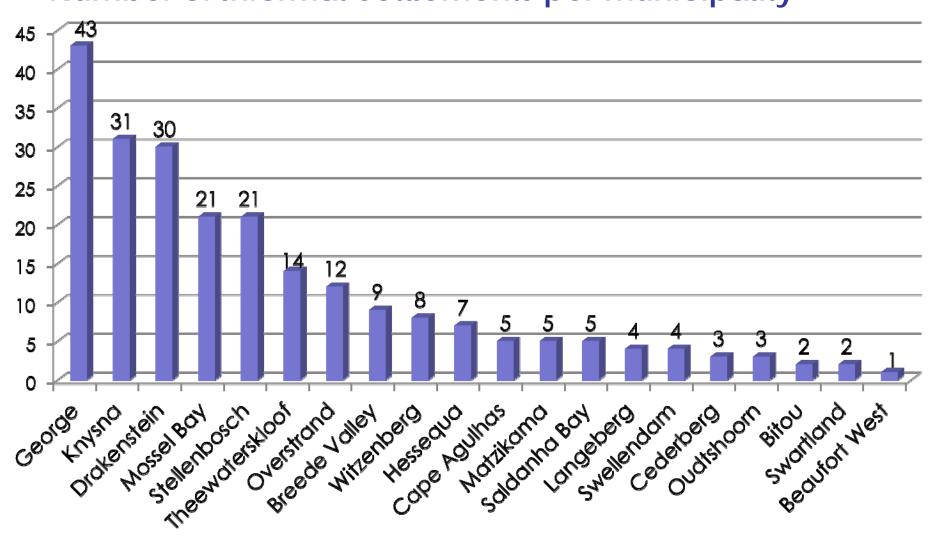
How big is the problem?

The current situation

- People are living in informal areas without proper access to decent services (230 non-metro + 244 metro informal settlements)
- People are residing in backyards and are exploited by landlords
- People do not have security of tenure
- The situation is unlikely to change

NON-METRO

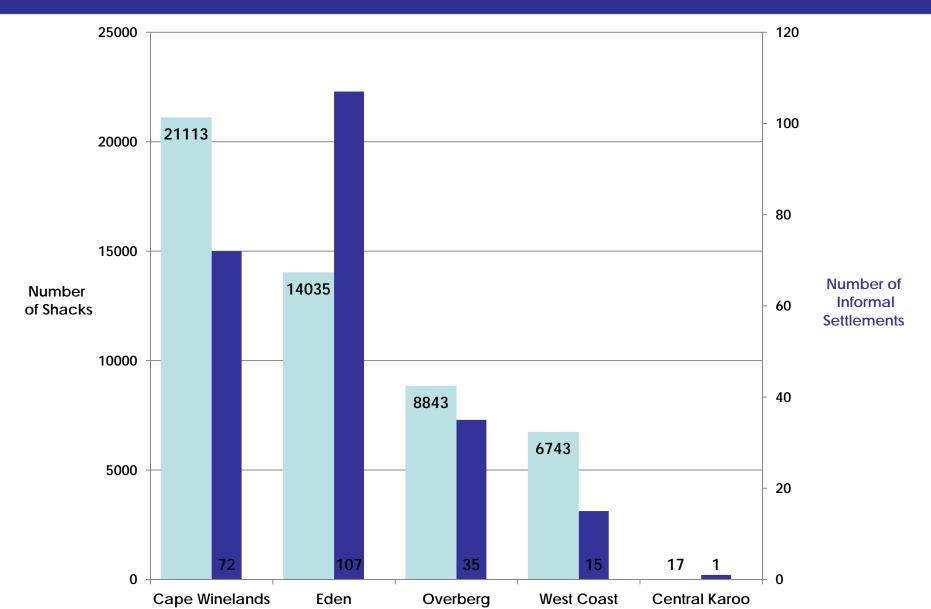
Number of Informal Settlements per municipality







Provincial Informal Settlement Data Base 2010 – per district



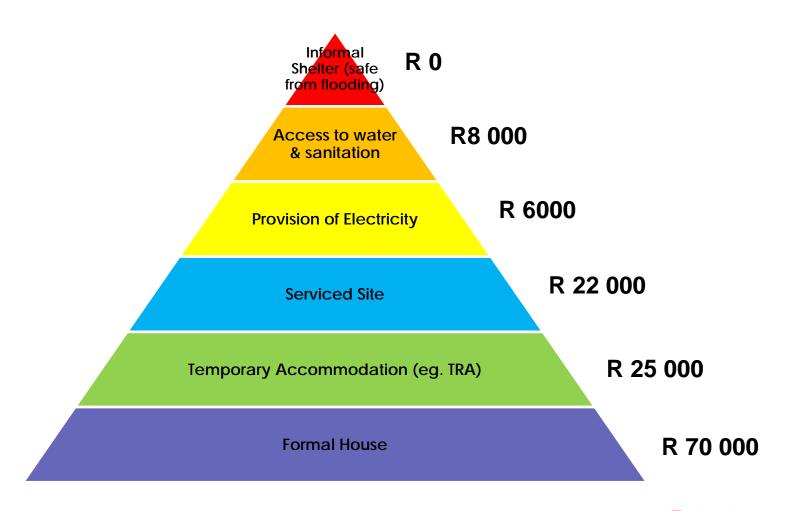
CITY OF CAPE TOWN

- Number of informal settlements as at November 2009 – 244
- Number of families in informal settlements roughly 180,000
- Number of houses constructed in 2010/2011 12 000. In City of Cape Town roughly 7,000 constructed by City and Province – N2 and other City and province projects
- Annual growth in demand 18,000.
- Expected time required to build houses for all people residing in informal settlements if there is no growth in need – more than 25 years!

BASIC SERVICES TO ALL BY 2014

- A national target has been set to provide basic services to all by 2014
- Provincial Minister has also pronounced on the target of ensuring that there are no informal settlements without access to basic services by 2014
- The problem in the Western Cape is the greatest in the level of services rendered to people living in informal settlements
- The department is committed to play a role in the achievement of the national target

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Funding Allocation Model

The FAM combines four factors in order to calculate each municipalities share of the allocated funds, these four factors are:

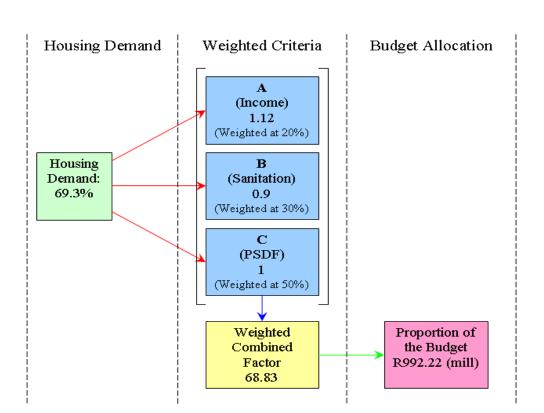
The number of households without adequate housing in the municipality; The number of low income households in the municipality; The number of households without adequate sanitation in the municipality; and The Growth Potential and Social Needs of the municipality.

A major strength of the model is its ability to modify the allocation of housing funds based on the weighting placed on specific factors.

The following factors can be weighted to increased their importance in the model:

- Low-income Households;
- Lack of Sanitation; and
- PSDF rating.
