- 4. The bidder is required to submit a valid certified B-BBBEE certificate or an affidavit.
- 5. No services may be rendered, or goods delivered before an official FFC Purchase Order has been issued and received.
- 6. The successful bidder will be expected to sign a service level agreement (SLA) soon after the Purchase Order is issued and received (where applicable).
- 7. This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 system as prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017.

1. BACKGROUND

In accordance with the provision of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (No:85 of 1993) all government buildings or offices are obliged to provide a clean, healthy, hygienic, and safe working environment.

The Financial and Fiscal Commission (FFC) wishes to procure a Service Provider to provide Housekeeping Services at the Cape Town Office.

The Cape Town Office location is **Constitution House**, **124 Adderley Street**, **12**th **Floor**, **Cape Town** the total office space is **288 square meters**.

2. CONTRACT PERIOD

The expected duration of the contract is twenty-four (24) months after the signing of the contract.

3. OBJECTIVE

The main objective of this procurement is to provide, as far as reasonably practical a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of the employees and visitors in compliance with the provision of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (No:85 of 1993)

A Service Provider will be appointed for a proposed period of twenty-four (24) months.



4. SERVICES REQUIRED

- Availability of cleaning personnel onsite at all times when the office is in operation and must be in the office at least 1 hour prior to commencement of business working hours (07h00)
- Cleaning of offices to include (daily cleaning of all offices, including desks and chairs, bathrooms, reception area, kitchen/dining areas, boardrooms, storeroom, emptying of bins in all areas and tidying the kitchen)
- Carpets to be vacuumed twice a week
- Windowsills must be cleaned once a week and inside Windows to be cleaned every three months
- Electronic Equipment including (computers, laptops, printers and TV's to be cleaned as per Covid-19 regulations and guidelines
- The Service Provider must supply all cleaning materials as per Covid-19 regulations and also provide an industrial strength vacuum cleaner for the duration of the Contract.
- Covid-19 compliant Deep Cleaning and Fogging of Offices must be done every three (3) months including shampooing the carpets (Accredited certificate of compliance after each clean required)
- The Service Provide must provide Checklists to monitor the following Services (Bathrooms, Stock Control of Pantry Consumables, Cleaning products) as periodically required (Hourly, Daily, Weekly, Monthly, Quarterly or Annually)
